Our Memory Verse this week:

"Come and see the works of the Lord." Psalm 66:5

Today we discovered:

- Testimonies declare the works of the Lord
- The testimony teaches how to see the unseen
- The written and spoken testimony describes God's relationship with us
- The testimony of the Lord invites His Kingdom to come to earth

Parent's Points to Ponder:

In this lesson your child has received a very powerful tool for their journey to bring Heaven to earth: the testimony of the Lord. The testimony, or declaring the mighty works of God, helps us "see" and discover who our Father is, how He relates to us, and what His Kingdom looks like. Whether we read an account from the Bible, or a person shares what God has done personally for them, the "testimony" reminds us how great, wonderful, powerful, and loving our Papa God really is!

Ask Your Child:

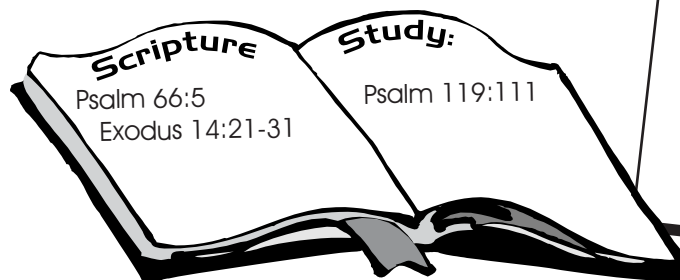
What happens when you share a testimony? (tells how great God is, and glorifies Him). When you hear a testimony what do you "see"? (God's Kingdom). What was put in your backpack? (a magnifying glass).

Soaking Time:

As soft instrumental music is playing, lead your child in thanking Father God for His greatness and goodness. Read Psalm 66:5 and ask the Holy Spirit to show what the Father has done personally for them. Join with your child in a time of rejoicing and praise.

Home Activity:

On a piece of paper, draw a picture of a magnifying glass and write Psalm 66:5, "... see the works of the Lord." Help your child attach a page each day with a drawing that shows God doing a mighty work described in the Bible. You can also add a picture or written testimony of what God has personally done for them, your family or friends. You can post the pages on the "Heaven's Window" bulletin board, or make them into a book of God's mighty works.
